

- The Diocese is building a fund to generate earnings to pay for actuarily estimated costs for long-term care for priests.






Funded Status of the Priest Long-Term Care Endowment & Pension Plans

Sacraments of Initiation


- "Signs of God's grace in our lives", the Sacraments of Christian Initiation include Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.
- **Baptism**: the first and Chief sacrament of forgiveness of sins because it unites us with Christ who dies for our sins and rose for our justification.
- Confirmation: completes the grace of Baptism by a special outpouring of the gifts of the Holy Spirit, which seal or "confirm" the baptized union with Christ and equip them for an active participation in the worship of the apostolic life of the Church.
- **Eucharist**: is the source and summit of the Christian life and completes Christian initiation.



An uptick in sacramentals is trending.






Fiscal Year 2022-23



Diocesan Financial Support

- The Diocese provides support for some small parishes in order to maintain a Catholic presence in parts of the Diocese with a lower Catholic population. Some smaller parishes additionally may need financial support for salaries and benefits for priests.
- Campus Ministry provides support to help continue faith journeys for many young adults in college and to serve as a resource for those who are new to the faith and for those returning to our faith.
- Support is also provided for the funding of priests in hospital ministries and that serve as Chaplains.

Church Growth and Expansion

- An influx of people have moved to the Triangle and North Carolina.
- In Raleigh, 10 years ago, the population was around 400,000 and since then it has grown to about 15 % to a total of 467,000.
- North Carolina was a top choice for people that relocated from state to state in 2019, according to the U.S. Census Bureau.
- Registered Catholics since 2010 has overall increased by 12.56% across deaneries.

- Overall, because of this increase in population, population growth is driving church expansion.








Deposits and Loans

- The Catholic Community and Deposit Loan Fund is a fund that has a positive multiplicative effect for the Diocesan community- at -large as we are all in this together.
- This fund provides a way to mitigate outside borrowing from banks as the Diocese provides loans for parishes which are able to demonstrate the ability to repay them.
 - Parishes can withdraw their deposits at any time.
 - Deposits that are not loaned out are invested in Risk-Free and Insured Instruments in order to grow deposits.

Deposits and Loans

- The Horne Memorial Revolving fund, funded by the Horne Sisters' Estate is an interest free fund that makes over \$5 million available for interest-free loans to small and needy parishes
- This fund provides an opportunity for parishes to save \$100,000 per year in interest expense that can instead be devoted to pastoral ministry and outreach.
- There were 20 outstanding loans as of June 2023.
- When fully loaned out, the Horne Fund saves parishes \$200,000 per year in interest expense.

Offertory has been stable and trending upward except for years impacted by Covid



Our parish offertory for the year ended June 2023 increased by ~6.4% over prior year.



Offertory

- As population has increased across Eastern North Carolina, so has the number of registered parishioners in some Deaneries.
- With increasing number of registered parishioners means that offertory has been steady and increasing across the years 2010-2023 except for the two years impacted by Covid, 2020 and 2021.
- Offertory is the single biggest source of revenue for parish ministries.
