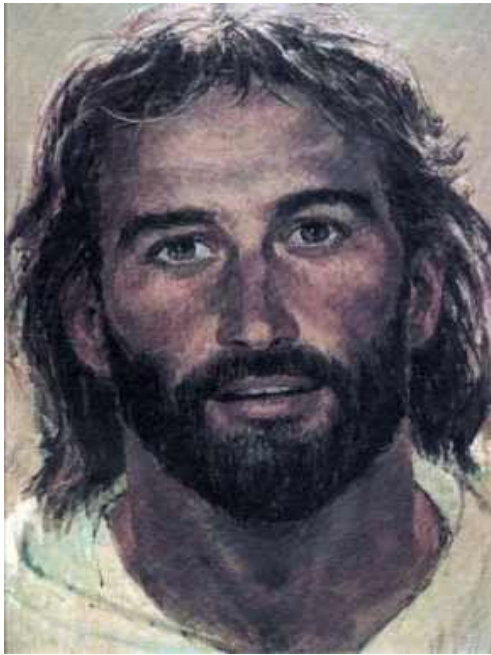


CURSILLO

What is Cursillo? The Cursillo is an encounter with Christ.



Cursillo (pronounced kur-see-yo) is a Spanish word meaning "little" or "short course."

The Cursillo 3-Day Retreat weekend begins on a Thursday evening and ends the following Sunday. During these three days, those attending listen to a series of talks given by priests, deacons, and laity. The talks present a method for living out our Catholic faith in a deeper way. Holy Mass, Reconciliation, Spiritual Direction, nightly Rosary, and the Eucharist is at the heart of the Cursillo weekend.

People who have made the 3-Day weekend are linked together in a spiritually satisfying program of reunions. This part of the Movement helps us support one another in our attempt to remain Christ-centered.

A Group Reunion is a weekly gathering of from three to six friends who share their enthusiastic faith in Jesus Christ. Each person shares his/her life experiences in the areas of piety, study and action. By spending 60 minutes together each week, these friends lend support to one another so as to renew and sustain their apostolic commitment and enthusiasm.
