Diocesan Update

Tristan provided updates from last meetings.

- Meeting with Endowment Foundation postponed due to Foundation Executive Director resignation.
- Launch of Tuition Assistance Program
- Highlighted the BIMO Collection dates Feb 21, 2021 and Mar 6, 2022
- Explained the mandate of the Black and Indian Mission Organization Grant for tuition assistance
- Outlined the five officially recognized communities that fall under the AAMEN umbrella although there are many more (African American, Igbo, Francophone, Swahili and Afro-Caribbean)
- Reiterated to group that we must take the lead in educating our parishes on Africa's foundational contribution to the universal Church.

Goals Team Update

Kevin Green presented the Goals Team's work on Goal Revision

- The team utilized a template that states goal, objectives (Key Performance Indicators-KPIs, Strategies, and Tactics)
- Goal #1: Addressing Social Justice (Addressing Racism)
 - o a) Acknowledge Racism within diocese
 - o b) Increase awareness of that racism
 - o c) Directly address Racism in the parishes
- Objectives
 - o a) Concur with Bishop on racism and plans to address
 - b) Acknowledge systemic racism through homilies on parish/diocesan level
- Strategies
 - o a) Schedule meetings with Bishop and AAMEN leadership

o b) Collaborate with bishop to develop a formal statement addressing diocesan racism

Tactics

- o a) Schedule two annual meetings with Bishop (one before June 2021 and second before December 2021)
- b) Publish the diocesan formal stand on racism to be published by November 2021
