What is the BAA?

The Bishop's Annual Appeal (BAA) is the Diocese of Raleigh's primary annual fundraising effort, uniting every parish in a shared mission to strengthen our Church's pastoral, educational, and charitable ministries. Through the generosity of parishioners across the diocese, the BAA provides essential funding for vocations and seminarian formation, Catholic Charities outreach, multicultural and catechetical programs, campus ministry, and support for parishes and schools of every size. Its impact is both practical and deeply spiritual: the BAA equips our diocesan community to serve those in need, accompany the faithful at every stage of life, and build a vibrant, growing Church rooted in hope and discipleship.

Where does the money raised from the BAA go?

What is the mission of the Bishop's Annual Appeal?

The mission of the Bishop's Annual Appeal is to empower the faithful to live out the Gospel by supporting the Church's efforts to evangelize, serve, and educate. Through your generosity, we proclaim Christ's message of hope and love, strengthen communities in need, and form the next generation of disciples. By opening our hearts and sharing our blessings, we ensure that the light of faith shines brightly in our parishes, schools, and outreach ministries, transforming lives and bringing the healing presence of Christ to all.



What happens if my parish exceeds its BAA goal?

When your parish exceeds its BAA Goal, 40% will be rebated directly back to your parish (in the form of a check mailed to the parish) in February of the following year.

Ways To Give:

- One-Time Gift Singular withdrawal. (Donation processed same day)
- **Sustainer/Recurring Gift** Ongoing monthly withdrawal with no end date; continues through each annual campaign. (*Withdrawn on your selected date*)
- Make a Pledge Commitment of a total donation over predetermined monthly installments in the current campaign year. (Withdrawn on the 1st of the month)
- **Pledge Payment** Single payment on an existing pledge. (*Donation processed same day*)
- Stock Donation, QCD, Donor Advised Fund

What is a Sustainer?

If a donor sets up a recurring monthly gift with no end date, the donor will be considered a "Sustainer." The donor will receive a "Sustainer Prayer Card" for special recognition of their unwavering generosity. A sustainer's recurring gift will continue to each campaign year unless a change or cancellation is requested by the donor. The donor can request a change or termination of their recurring gift by emailing giving.support@raldioc.org or calling 984.900.3192.



Local Parish Capital Campaigns and Guaranteed Goals

If a parish is conducting a capital campaign for which pledges can be paid over a period of months or years, it must guarantee the Bishop's Annual Appeal goal for each year of the active solicitation plus the year following the conclusion of active solicitation.

There are two options for fulfilling the guaranteed goal:

1. Conduct the Bishop's Annual Appeal as usual along with all other parishes.

This is strongly recommended. The parish can raise as much as it can toward its Bishop's Annual Appeal goal. There may be numerous parishioners who are willing to support both asks. This also maintains annual education efforts about the services provided by the Bishop's Annual Appeal ministries.

2. Incorporate the Bishop's Annual Appeal goal and message into your capital campaign appeal. This option can only be chosen for the first year of the appeal.

It is important to communicate to all parishioners that part of the funds from a local capital campaign appeal will go to support the parish's Bishop's Annual Appeal goal. Thus, the parish needs to include the appeal information in its case material.

In either option above, all parishes with a guaranteed appeal goal due to a capital campaign will be invoiced the amount of the parish goal at the conclusion of the active solicitation period of the Bishop's Annual Appeal. The invoice is payable upon receipt.



Role of Pastoral Leader

The success of the 2026 Bishop's Annual Appeal depends greatly on the committed, visible, and faith-filled leadership of each Pastor, Pastoral Administrator, and BAA volunteer. When parish leaders actively support the Appeal, they inspire their communities to respond with generosity, trust, and a shared sense of mission. Parishioners consistently rise to the level of sacrifice invited by the example and encouragement of their spiritual leaders.

Leadership Responsibilities:

> Select BAA Leadership Team & Volunteers

Appoint parish BAA coordinators and volunteers and share their contact information with **sarah.macey@raldioc.org**.

> Equip and Guide Your Team

Ensure all volunteers understand how to use BAA materials and resources; provide ongoing direction, encouragement, and oversight.

> Model Strong, Positive Leadership

Communicate the importance of the Appeal with clarity and enthusiasm, helping parishioners see the mission and impact behind their participation.

> Encourage Full Parish Engagement

Work with your team to plan effective outreach and follow-up so every household has the opportunity to participate in the 2026 Appeal. Increased participation is a goal for 2026!

Connect the BAA to Parish Life

Regularly highlight how BAA-funded ministries directly support your parish, neighboring communities, and the mission of the Diocese in Eastern North Carolina.

> Steward your Parishioners

You will receive a weekly report of your donors. Thank them, stand in the atrium and welcome them, have coffee with them, write them a quick note or email

Role of BAA Volunteers

Active, mission-driven lay leaders are essential to the success of the Bishop's Annual Appeal. BAA volunteers serve as the bridge between the diocesan mission and the parish community—offering time, energy, and leadership to help ensure a fruitful and inspiring Appeal.

Responsibilities:

- Collaborate with the Pastor or Pastoral Administrator to identify, plan, and implement the most effective strategies for inviting parishioner participation and support.
- Serve as a positive ambassador for the Appeal, fostering a spirit of generosity, confidence, and enthusiasm within the parish. Including speaking at masses if you feel comfortable. It is always great to hear a
- Ensure accurate and timely completion of the BAA Parish Tracking Form, reviewing all entries and maintaining records within the parish.
- **Gather and report weekly updates** on parish giving progress to help guide planning and communication to parish and Pastor.
- Monitor your parish's BAA performance using Blackbaud Raiser's Edge NXT, ensuring real-time understanding of participation and gift totals.
- Communicate the impact of the Bishop's Annual Appeal, helping parishioners
 understand how funded ministries directly support the needs of the parish, the
 community, and the wider Church.
- Identify donors for Pastor cultivation, stewardship and relationships as gifts come in.

BAA Commitment Weekends

1. Location & Setup

Where to Place Gift Stations

- Set up Gift Stations in the Vestibule/Narthex/Cornerstone.
- Use **clearly marked baskets** for dropping off gifts.
- Signage: "BAA Gift Station" or put the poster next to it.

2. Two Weeks Before Gift Station Weekend

Pastor/Pastoral Administrator Announcement

- Make a verbal announcement at all Masses:
 - o Inform parishioners that **BAA Gift Stations** will be available soon.

3. One Week Before Gift Stations Are Used Bulletin Message #1

Print a bulletin notice reminding parishioners of the upcoming Gift Station weekend.

4. During Commitment Weekends Bulletin Message #2

- Include a second bulletin message during BAA weekends.
- Encourage PARTICIPATION.

5. Host Two Commitment Weekends

- Parishes are encouraged to host **two weekends** to maximize parishioner participation.
- Parishes may choose their own dates in February.

6. Use Gift Stations for at Least Two Consecutive Weeks

 Keep the Gift Stations available for a minimum of two weekends to allow all parishioners time to participate.

IMPORTANT: Be sure to tell parishioners to mark that their gift is going to YOUR parish. Use the drop-down menu online or indicate it on their checks.



Donation Process

Once you have conducted the in-pew solicitation process at your parish, processing those financial donations in a specific way is paramount. *To keep donations secure you must keep all transactions and cash counting in the parish office.* Please read carefully and follow the procedures below. If at any time you have questions or are uncertain about how to process a donation, please contact:

Basic Processing Steps

- 1. Open every envelope (even if sealed).
- 2. Look up the donor in your parish data management software.
- 3. Write the donor's diocesan constituent ID number (CID#) in the designated area on the commitment card.
- 4. Please DO NOT do the following in the CID field on the commitment card:
 - a. Write your parish number and/or name in this area. Your parish number and the donor's CID number are not the same.
 - b. Use CID# s that are prefaced with an asterisk* in your parish data management system. They are invalid and cause gifts to be credited to the wrong donor.
 - c. Write the parishioner's envelope number in the Diocesan CID# field.
- 5. *If a CID# is not found, submit without a number*. Development team will assign a CID# when processing the donation if full name and address information are provided.
- 6. Enter the donation information on your BAA Parish Tracking Form. *This tracking form remains at the parish. Do not send it to the lockbox.* This is for parish use only to keep track of their donations.
- 7. Follow the instructions in the section below depending on the gift type.



8. Return the commitment card to the original envelope before moving on to the next gift.

Gift Types

Personal Check - CID# should also be written on the personal check and returned to the original envelope with the commitment card.

Cash Gifts- with Identifiable Donor Information

- Cash MUST be converted to a parish check. DO NOT SEND CASH to the lockbox.
- Convert cash to one parish check and mail it with the commitment cards that are associated with that cash. (Recommend sending FedEx, UPS, USPS priority for tracking purposes)
- Please leave the memo line of the parish check blank. *Limit 25 commitment cards per parish check*
- Commitment cards and associated parish check MUST be kept together.
 *IMPORTANT: The total amount of the cash collected MUST equal the amount of the parish check.
 If it does not balance, the transaction will be rerouted to the diocesan Development department resulting in a delay in processing.

Loose/Anonymous Cash- (Cash with no commitment card or unidentifiable donor information)

- Combine all unaccompanied/unidentifiable cash together as if it were received with no commitment card. Convert cash to parish check.
- Complete a commitment card listing "Anonymous Cash Gift" in the name field.
- Include Parish Name and Parish City on the commitment card.
- *IMPORTANT: Do not include unaccompanied anonymous cash in the same parish check with cash gifts that are received with identifiable donor commitment cards. Separate parish checks should be written for each of these scenarios.

Credit Card- Parishioners must go online to make a credit card donation. givetobaa.org

Pledge- Parishioners must go online to make a pledge. <u>givetobaa.org</u>



*IMPORTANT: There may be an occasional one-off BAA donation that comes into the parish office either through the regular collection or as a walk-in during the week. If this occurs, follow the steps above based on the applicable scenario.

Final Steps

- 1. Verify that all donations have been entered on the BAA Parish Tracking Form.
- 2. Please remember to save your document.

 This is for parish auditing and donation tracking. The form remains at the parish. Do not send it to the lockbox.
- 3. Close the envelope, seal it and mail it out. *USPS Priority, FedEx, UPS mail comes with tracking capabilities; please be sure to save and document your tracking number.

Helpful Tips for Donation Processing:

Please utilize only current diocesan BAA materials. If our bank receives anything else, they will not process it. Instead, the bank returns all the materials - greatly delaying the parish's campaign, data updates, and processing of payments.

Paper clips, staples, and tape cannot be used when processing donations because they obstruct the machines and removing them costs valuable processing time. Rubber bands or separate envelopes are an option.

To keep donations secure you must keep all transactions and cash counting in the parish office.

Please remember to keep your donation tracking form at the parish (this is for your records and auditing purposes) and do not send it to the lockbox. This can cause confusion and delays in processing.

Online Giving

Please encourage online giving as the foremost way to give to the Bishop's Annual Appeal. Our main giving page is https://dioceseofraleigh.org/give/baa. Your parish should link back to the Bishop's Annual Appeal main giving page on your parish website. This is the most efficient and organized way to manage BAA donations.

In order to mitigate errors and delays, please refrain from using your parish online giving (third-party online giving services) to collect BAA donations and link directly to the diocesan BAA online giving pages: https://dioceseofraleigh.org/give/baa
