## **Resurrection Cookies**

Use this tasty object lesson to teach your children more about Easter. Preheat oven to 300F and gather your supplies: Bible 1 cup whole pecans Zipper baggie Wooden Spoon 1 tsp. vinegar 3 egg whites Pinch salt 1 cup sugar Tape

Place pecans in baggie. Let children beat them with the wooden spoon to break into small pieces -Explain that Jesus was arrested, then beaten by the Roman soldiers. Read John 19:1-3.3.

Let each child smell the vinegar. Put vinegar into a mixing bowl -Explain that when Jesus was thirsty on the cross He was given vinegar to drink. Read John 19:28-30.4.

Add egg whites to vinegar. Eggs represent life -Explain that Jesus gave His life to give us life. Read John 10:10-11.5.

Sprinkle a little salt into each child's hand. Let them taste it and brush the rest into the bowl -Explain this represents the salty tears shed by Jesus' followers and the bitterness of our own sin. Read Luke 23:27.

## So far the ingredients are not very appetizing.

Add sugar -Explain the sweetest part of the story is Jesus died because He loves us. He wants us to know this and how to belong to Him. Read Ps. 34:8 & John 3:16.7.

Beat with a mixer on high speed for 12 to 15 minutes until stiff peaks are formed -Explain that white represents the purity we have in God's eyes when Jesus cleanses our sins. Read Isaiah 1:18 and John 3:1-3.8.

Fold in nuts. Drop by tsp onto a cookie sheet covered with waxed paper -Explain the mounds represent the rocky tomb where Jesus' body was laid. Read Matt. 27:57-60.9.

Put the cookie sheet in the oven, close the door and turn the oven OFF.



Give each child a piece of tape and ask them to "seal" the oven door -Explain that Jesus' tomb was sealed. Read Matt.27:65-66.11.

GO TO BED! Explain they may feel sad to leave the cookies in the oven overnight. Jesus' followers were sad when the tomb was sealed. Read John 16:20 and 22.12.

On Easter morning, open the oven and give everyone a cookie -Notice the cracked surface. Take a bite to discover the cookies are hollow! On the first Easter Jesus' followers were amazed to find the tomb open and empty!

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
