According to the diary of St. Faustina our Lord said, "I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy."

Extraordinary graces

In three places in her *Diary*, St. Faustina records our Lord's promises of specific, extraordinary graces on Divine Mercy Sunday:

I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy (1109).



Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (300).

The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion will obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (699).

To receive these graces, the only condition is to receive Holy Communion worthily on Divine Mercy Sunday (or the Vigil celebration) by making a good Confession beforehand and staying in the state of grace and trusting in His Divine Mercy. By these conditions, our Lord is emphasizing the value of Confession and Holy Communion as miracles of mercy. The Eucharist is Jesus, Himself, the Living God, longing to pour Himself as Mercy into our hearts.

In addition, our Lord says through St. Faustina that we are to perform acts of mercy:

"Yes, the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also be acts of mercy" (742).

"The graces of My mercy are drawn by means of one vessel only, and that is trust. The more a soul trusts, the more it will receive" (1578).

The worthy reception of the Eucharist on Divine Mercy Sunday is sufficient to obtain the extraordinary graces promised by Jesus. A plenary indulgence, obtained by fulfilling the usual conditions, also is available.

My story today revolves around a 200-bed hospice in the Bronx and probably the best job I ever had as a registered nurse. I do not remember why I first applied to the facility. I think it was because one of my dear friends in nursing school and I were in the hospital for surgery at the same time. I left without any worries, my friend, however, was diagnosed with cancer with metastasis to the lungs. She had 4 small children and a husband who blamed himself for her diagnosis. The person who held the household together was dying,

and the lack of support for her from her family was missing.

I learned from working with hospice patients that I just had to be present to the person I was standing or sitting in front of. I learned that the steps to death and dying are personal and cannot be rushed.

Let me speak about today. I saw a

post on our community Facebook page. The husband was thanking the "community" for the prayerful support he and his wife were getting from us. We can bring food, and spend time with the person in need, but the thanks were for guidance and prayer. This gentleman stated he could feel the love through the prayers offered, and the struggles in decisionmaking were less of a burden due to the Christ -centered support. Even though we live with Christ in our hearts, I know there are times

when we ask why, and maybe when, which, where as well.

I believe we are solid in our faith and can move forward daily. But, sometimes, we get stuck. We search but feel abandoned. There is a good chance, we use the stages of dying as we seek the answer from God. The stages of "dying" as put forth by Elizabeth Kubler-Ross are: denial, anger, bargaining, depression and acceptance. I have lived and worked with these stages my whole professional life, and still do so today.

Sometimes I am just a pouty, cranky kid. I want what I want when I want it. Have any of you



ever been in that state as an adult? I basically go through the stages set forth by Kubler-Ross. Fortunately, it does not take months to move through these stages. I do not do the depression stage well, so I just give myself a couple of hours of being pouty and cranky and move to acceptance.

God [through Jesus, Mary, St

Joseph, the Holy Ghost and countless saints] has shown me that if in my challenges I seek Him right away, I find peace and answers that satisfy my inner self. I think I am preaching to the choir, but the Lord seems to want me to put this forth. I hope and pray that each of you finds the journey you travel and the burdens you struggle with are given to God for His Glory and Mercy, as He returns your trust in His infinite love to you.






